Motion to accept July's Minutes as written

Follow Up Business

Labor Day Celebration – Discussion for celebration: August 31, 2013, 6:30 pm, City Park. Council members to arrive at 5:00 pm for set up. Harts – food and ice, Ted – soda and melon supervision, proposed that Heber Dunford and Charles Hulme be contacted for wagon rides and tour guide, Mayor Dunford – fireworks. At this time there are no Fire Department regulations against fireworks. If a regulation is put in place before celebration we will need to apply for a permit, which will be granted because of prior contact. Rich Kearn will spray park prior to party.

Motion to approve 2014 budget of \$323,029.00 as proposed

Water – Discussion of delinquent water accounts. Jay was checking about right-of-way to read water meters to clarify city rights. Shaun Turner will need new batteries – bill for around \$300.00 should come in. The water meter wand is still in for repair.

Overflow – Drillers want to put in tank, Shaun is checking with DEQ. City has permit for drillers to use water that will need renewal in December.

Sewer – Report sent on July 9, received July 22, Jason Linford engineer stated healthy lagoon - good report. Winston and Jay will follow up on bid from Bear Lake Construction to clarify the representation of 1 unit. Doug's bid will be accepted, no starting date set. Jay stated that Jason was uncomfortable with going down the center so the motion from July will stand. When water level is lowered, Doug is ready to go. Winston will check with Doug on Public Work License and Insurance Accord forms. Jay was given permission to put in 2nd drain per his discretion. Discussion about lift pump, decision to buy hose because of cost of digging under highway.

Offer made by Roy Bunderson to donate land down Madsen Lane to be used for Anaerobic digester so existing and new building can hook up to sewer, donation may eliminate the need for the lift pump. Donation subject to allowing Roy to connect one connection to sewer if he ever builds North of Madsen Lane without annexing.

Motion made to have Sunrise determine cost and feasibility to put in line on donated ground.

Ted McGhee Dave Madsen No discussion Vote Unanimous

Payment to Sunrise discussed, request for more detailed billing.

Roads – County and Brad bladed roads. Estimate for Brad – 2 hours at \$65.00. Paris Hills rented Doug’s water truck. Mag water was applied down Madsen Lane, 50 East, and Simpsons. Cost should be less than \$200.00. Montpelier will not be paving or fixing pot holes. Top Shot from Logan will do this work. Estimated cost: \$6000.00. Suggested a Thank you note be sent to Paris Hills which Roy will draft and get to Debbie.

P & Z –

Development Permit – No change in building permit – no charge for no change in footprint.

City Hall/Offices – Ted stated that the door still needs to be installed at the garage. Roy said it would be done. Ted proposed putting in bathroom at City Hall. Roy suggested that now might be the time to do this project.

Motion made for Ted to work on plans and get quotes for new restrooms.
