October 14, 2015

Invocation: Shaun Turner

Called to order at 7:00 pm by Roy Bunderson acting in the mayor's absence.

Attendees: Roy Bunderson, Shaun Turner, Ted McGhee, Debbie Thomas, and Marilyn Wilkes, Mayor David Madsen was available by phone if needed. Rich Kearl was absent.

Visitor: Clyde Rainey and Jason Lindford – Sunrise Engineering, and Philip Ward

Review of Minutes from September 16, 2015

Motion to accept both August 8 & 31, 2015 minutes as written.

Roy Bunderson, Rich Kearl, Vote Unanimous

Mayor Entertained a motion to move Minutes moved behind Sunrise and Philip Ward

Shaun Turner, Ted McGhee, Vote Unanimous

Sunrise Engineering – Clyde Rainey & Jason Linford presented the Water Study.

Roy started by thanking both Jason and Clyde for all their hard work on behalf of the city.

Clyde went over summary and numbers of Water Study Plan that has been approved by DEQ. Top concerns Jason has:

1. No Secondary water source – Tying together of the systems fulfills this concern.
2. Delivery of water to city from tank through 8" line.

Where do we go from here?

Public Notice – 14 day period where public has an option to weigh in, including a public meeting where Sunrise will present alternatives. Tentative date may be the December Council Meeting for presentation to the city. Then:

1. Council will then make a decision based on public opinion
2. Create Environmental Information Document

Shaun expressed his concern as babysitter of our water system – he was very concerned about the daily maintaince of the system. Daily drive to tank to change the batteries for the chlorinator, he asked that we explore the option of replacing batteries by solar power, and a chlorinating system that will be self-controlled instead of daily checking.

Sunrise has responded to the conditions contained in the Study approval letter to DEQ.

Philip Ward for Taylor Ward Eagle Project – Projected cost: \$1500.00 to \$2000.00 dollars for the sign. A note of permission was received from present owner of proposed site for sign, but no promise for the future if the property is sold was addressed in that permission.

Shaun suggested that some fund raising projects be completed by Taylor to help fund his project. It was discussed the placement of the sign on the North side of town or alternate spot. The Council is leery to have a sign placed on a property that the right for the sign to remain is not intact. The Council asked Philip to pursue alternate spots. A special meeting will be called if needs be to get project completed on time.

Follow Up – Roy expressed a concern about the amount billed and payed to “Out on a Limb” for tree trimming on the cemetery road. He questioned what the other expense of \$600.00 included?

Mayoral Business –

Sewer – A formal motion needs to be made for the payment of \$250.00 per year to David Matthews to keep up his operator’s license.

Water – Dunford’s water issue will be addressed with Shaun by Roy. They will take care of the problem, even if it means the water be turned off. Roy and Ted have an idea and want to discuss with Mayor.

City Hall/Offices – Ted expressed, once again, the concern of steps and electricity to back of ambulance building. Roy will contact Tyler about the wiring of this building.

The council asked that a reminder be given to Karen about keeping the Hall locked.

Ted expressed a concern over the dog problem in Bloomington.

Roads – Rick will be putting gravel by Heber’s house. Roy has put in an ITD application for help with patching roads.

Delinquent Accounts – The bill to the Allred’s will now be increased by \$120.00. How to handle other delinquent accounts in the city was discussed.

Payment of Expenses –

Motion to accept September’s expenses and pay as presented.

Ted Mcghee, Shaun Turner, Vote Unanimous

No Motion to adjourn, did not have a quorum, at this point, as Shaun had to leave early.
