Follow Up Business

Paris Hills – Update on activity of the hill. Project is concentrating on DFS water Management. Projects outcome will be determined on the water sample outcome. Bankable feasibility is the next step. Will have 3 more open houses for the public to attend within the next 60 days. Water management and monitoring will continue at this stage. Erin Trevin was introduced and gave his background/ history. Dan Goicacehea informs council of his leaving due to personal matters. He thanks the City of Bloomington for their hospitality and friendship, the council gives thanks as well. Boart-longyear will be the new Company that they will be working with instead of Major.

Water –Scouts were able to find several valves and got them cemented. Still waiting to find the main valve by the City Hall. Talked about the possibility of painting the valve lids so that they

are easier to find. Jacob Reese will continue to move forward on this project. Shawn Turner informed Council that he will continue to work towards getting all samples to where they need to be on time. DEQ hired third party inspector to do tank inspection, report was sent off, and results should be expected soon, possibly in a month.

Shawn suggested Council follow up on facilities management, especially since grant and reimbursement were offered and there have been no results.

Sewer – Pump arrived last week; it is located at Wayne Lloyd’s house. Waiting for valve extensions. Initial seepage test looks like things are starting to improve. Eric is aware of the damage on dikes and it will be addressed. Sample was viewed from DEQ, everything is on hold until we see what they will let us do.

Roads – Transportation up Bloomington Canyon will be limited as per Dan Goicacehea’s statement that there are only going to be 3 holes for mining this winter up the canyon. The plow will not be held back from plowing roads this winter. There is a concern about running over valves that are in the middle of the road. The man hole by Richard Nelsons has been done and looks good.

P & Z – Ordinances and Resolutions sent by Winston Hart have been reviewed and discussed. Time and effort will be made towards locating Ordinances from previous city council members as well as facilities used by and for the City of Bloomington. Also efforts will be made to organize these Ordinances as well as furthermore to keep minutes for further references. Suggestions were made to modify development permit and that is still in the works.

City council approved \$20.00 bill needed to pay Robert Ward for work on the sewer man hole.

City Hall/Offices – The replacement of the door to the ambulance shed has already been paid for. Ideas and thoughts were brought out about modifying the bathrooms to the city hall, to help make them handicap accessible. Ted will proceed with this. Working on getting a new flag as well as reviewing the price of the City Hall rental, Winston is working on this.
