1976 SURVEY

On 24 July 1976, the Bloomington Cemetery was surveyed by Lotwick I. Reese, a licensed professional engineer in the State of Idaho. The survey was established by locating the center line of the east-west roadways, referenced from the iron pipe markers placed by the original survey in the sagebrush west of the Cemetery.

Selected corners of the cemetery were then surveyed and 23 permanent concrete markers were installed for future reference. Later steel posts were driven next to the concrete markers for easy reference, especially in the winter months. Mr. Reese surveyed and designated gravesites at the **top west portion** of the cemetery beginning from A2 to A9 across the top and then from 1 to 108.

The corners were established so that any lot in the cemetery could be measured with a 100 foot tape or chain.

2016 SURVEY

Permanent concrete markers were also installed for future reference. In addition, steel posts were driven next to the concrete markers for easier reference.
